Please Note: Credit earned through the Demonstrated Competency Assessment program is accepted by all public and charter schools as supported by Utah State Law. However, students enrolled at private schools or home-school programs should speak with their school district administrator prior to engaging in the Demonstrated Competency Assessment process.

Students pursuing college athletic careers: The NCAA, National Collegiate Athletic Association, does NOT recognize courses completed through credit-by-exam.

Students pursuing the Utah Regents' Scholarship:

Students must receive letter grades in required courses to be eligible for the Utah Regents' Scholarship. Credit earned by exam will NOT be accepted.

## DEMONSTRATED COMPETENCY ASSESSMENT

The Utah State Board of Education rule
R277-705-3c requires school districts to provide
opportunities for students to demonstrate
competency by passing a state-approved
Demonstrated Competency Assessment.

- Demonstrated Competency Assessments are available to all high school students.
- Students may take a Demonstrated Competency Assessment any time in grades 9—12.
- Students earn required credit for passing
   Demonstrated Competency Assessments.
- Students are responsible for acquiring and retaining the content knowledge and skills needed to pass a Demonstrated Competency Assessment.
- Demonstrated Competency Assessments reflecting one semester or one full year of subject content are worth .50 credit and 1.0 credit toward graduation, respectively. Students receive a "P" (pass) for earning credit. No letter grades are awarded.
- To take a Demonstrated Competency
   Assessment, students submit an application signed by their school counselor or administrator and a parent or legal guardian.
- A Demonstrated Competency Assessment may be taken only once per year, per subject tested.

### How the Northern Utah Testing Center can work for you...

Students should schedule to meet and discuss the Demonstrated Competency Assessment program with their school counselor or administrator. If the

Demonstrated Competency Assessment is right for the student, complete the following



steps to schedule an appointment at the Testing Center:

- 1. Download and complete the Student Application. Make sure the form is signed by the school counselor or administrator and by a parent or legal guardian. Web address: http://www.davis.k12.ut.us/testingcenter
- 2. The student or school counselor may call the Testing Center at (801) 402-5385 to schedule a testing appointment.
- 3. Bring the signed application and picture I.D. to the testing appointment.
- 4. Arrive at the Testing Center approximately 10 minutes prior to the scheduled appointment time. Please allow 1—2 hours to complete the assessment.

Tests have more than one section and will require additional testing appointments to complete.

- 5. Students must pass the first assessment section in order to proceed with additional sections.
- 6. Assessment results will be mailed to the student, and emailed to the school counselor, after results have been calculated. Please allow 1—3 weeks for results.

NOTE: For students with special needs or traveling long distances, please contact the Testing Center Coordinator, as accommodations suited to the student's needs may be made in advance.
